Strategies of IDI


- 1. Strengthening institutions of health sector

- 6. Promotion of public health at the community leg





Outputs of IDI


- Total contribution by Dec 2002: US\$ 1.8 billion
- GFATM: US\$ 200 million
- Grant aid: US\$ 80 million to 42 countries (FY2000)
- Partnership with NGO: US\$ 10 million (FY2000)
- Technical cooperation : 765 experts (FY2000)
- Volunteers: 648 to 64 countries (FY2000)
- Joint project formulation missions: with US (Nigeria, Nepal, etc); with Canada (Malawi)
- Human resources development : (FY2000) training 2,437 health experts/officials from 84 countries; more than 20,000 persons in sites














Challenges
